OUR STORY



Lincoln Heights Outreach, Inc. (LHOI) was established in 2012 with a clear and compelling vision: to uplift, empower, and walk alongside the residents of Lincoln Heights and surrounding communities. Rooted in community and established by visionary leaders of Lincoln Heights Missionary Baptist Church, LHOI began as a grassroots response to real community needs—grounded in dignity, compassion, and a deep commitment to service.



Founded in 1946 as one of the first self-governed African American communities in the United States, Lincoln Heights is a community rich in history, resilience, and culture—shaped by generations of residents whose strength, pride, and perseverance define its spirit. Yet, it has faced longstanding system challenges that impact the well-being of its children, families, and seniors. LHOI was created to meet those challenges head-on, providing practical support, strategic programming, and a steadfast belief in the strength and potential of its people.

Today, LHOI offers a range of holistic services—from food distribution, clothing support, and emergency assistance to Café HOPE, a community meal program, and a thriving garden, as well as workforce development, before- and after-school and summer enrichment for children in grades K–5 and Adult Day Service —each designed to promote stability, expand opportunity, and support long-term well-being.

As we look to the future, LHOI remains grounded in its core values. We are proud to stand with the Village of Lincoln Heights and surrounding communities, continuing to grow, adapt, and build pathways for our neighbors not just to succeed—but to thrive.

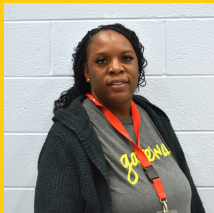

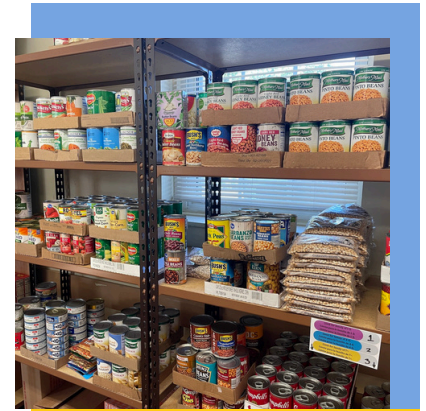
OUR 2025 JOURNEY STARTS

Food Pantry & Grow Garden: Planting Hope & Nourishing Community

This year, the Food Pantry continued to be a vital lifeline for neighbors facing food insecurity, providing consistent access to nutritious, culturally relevant food for hundreds of households. Thousands of pounds of groceries—including fresh produce and proteins—were distributed through the dedication of volunteers, strong partnerships, and generous community support.

The launch of our biweekly Saturday Choice Pantry last fall expanded access for working individuals and families, empowering neighbors to select foods that best meet their needs.

We also celebrated an exciting milestone with the return of the Grow Garden. After a period of inactivity, the garden was brought back to life, renewing community pride and expanding access to fresh, locally grown produce. Volunteers and neighbors came together to plant, harvest, and learn, and the produce was shared directly with Food Pantry guests.

Turning Hardship into Hope

For a second year, the Rent & Utility Assistance Program has transformed lives—putting roofs over heads, keeping families in their homes, the lights on, and hope alive during times of sudden hardship such as job loss, a serious illness or injury, death of a loved one, and other unexpected challenges. By providing timely assistance, the program was able to prevent eviction, reduce stress, and stabilize households so families can focus on rebuilding their lives.

Funded through generous support from the United Way of Greater Cincinnati, this program has become a vital part of our safety net, ensuring that neighbors in our community have access to the resources they need when they need them most. Through this funding, combined with the dedication of our staff and volunteers, dozens of households received life-changing assistance.

The Before and After School Program at Lincoln Heights Elementary School continues to provide students K-5th with a safe, structured, and enriching environment.

For many of our families, reliable before and after school care is more than a convenience — it is a necessity. Your support ensures that children begin their mornings in a structured, welcoming environment and end their afternoons engaged, encouraged, and cared for.

The impact extends beyond academics. Students are building friendships, developing social-emotional skills, and growing in confidence. Families experience stability and peace of mind knowing their children are cared for in a positive, nurturing setting.

Last summer, LHOI Summer Camp reached an exciting new milestone. **For the first time ever, summer camp was offered free of charge, opening the door for even more youth to participate in a summer filled with learning, creativity, and exploration.**

LHOI Summer Camp enrollment more than doubled, welcoming over 100 campers from across Hamilton County, ages 5–12, for six weeks at Lincoln Heights Elementary School. Each day, our campus buzzed with energy as youth discovered new interests, formed friendships, and engaged in hands-on activities designed to spark curiosity and confidence.

From creative arts and outdoor adventures to robotics, video game design, cooking, and gardening, campers were encouraged to try new things, express themselves, and grow in a safe and supportive environment. **As a proud member of the American Camp Association,** our program meets nationally recognized standards for safety, staff training, and program quality—giving families confidence that their children are not only having fun, but are cared for in a setting built on best practices and excellence.

Clothing Closet: More than clothing— It's confidence and care

Our Clothing Closet is a vital resource for the individuals and families we serve. We provide clothing, shoes, and essential toiletry items to men, women, and youth, ensuring that basic apparel needs are met in a dignified and accessible way.

Through the generosity of our donors and community partners, we were able to clothe over **382 individuals**. Their support allows us to keep this program stocked and available to those who need it most, while continuing to advance our broader mission of compassion, dignity, and community care.

Adult Day Service: Compassionate care in a community setting.

The Adult Day Services (ADS) program has been providing a safe, engaging, and supportive environment for seniors 60 and older since 2019. The program continues to offer meaningful activities, social interaction, and personalized care, helping seniors maintain independence, build friendships, and stay active.

This past year, the program welcomed more seniors than ever, 52, offering a range of activities from arts and crafts to exercise and wellness sessions. Our team of dedicated staff worked closely with each senior and their family, ensuring their needs were being met while fostering a sense of belonging and connection. Through structured programming and daily engagement, seniors benefit not only from care and support but also from opportunities to socialize and connect.

This program would not exist without the generous support and commitment of donors, making it possible to sustain and expand the program. Thanks to their contributions, the ADS program remains a reliable resource for seniors and their families, helping to ease caregiving responsibilities while enriching the lives of the seniors we serve.

OUTREACH: COMMUNITY AND CONNECTION



Community Impact Breakfast - May 17, 2025

This inaugural event marked an important milestone for LHOI, bringing together donors, partners, and community members for a morning of connection and celebration at Lincoln Heights Elementary School. The event highlighted the meaningful progress made throughout the year and recognized the vital role supporters play in advancing LHOI's mission. The breakfast also featured the unveiling of LHOI's Three-Year Strategic Plan, offering a clear vision for the future and outlining the steps ahead to expand our reach and deepen our impact in the community.



513Relief Bus - November 11, 2025

In partnership with Hamilton County and Lincoln Heights Baptist Church, LHOI supported the 513Relief Bus initiative to provide critical resources to families impacted by recent SNAP reductions. With support from the Freestone Foodbank, LHOI helped serve families by providing essential, nutrient-rich staples such as dairy, protein, eggs, rice, beans, and potatoes—ensuring that at least 100 households received food assistance during each distribution event. This collaboration strengthened our ability to meet immediate needs while supporting the well-being of our community.



Thanksgiving Distribution - November 22, 2025

This Thanksgiving, LHOI proudly served our community by distributing over 550 meals to families in need, including 300 prepared meals and an additional 250 meals along with turkeys for families to enjoy at home. This effort brought together the very best of our community—dedicated volunteers, generous donors, and committed partners—all working side by side to ensure no family went without a warm holiday meal. Together, we created not just meals, but moments of comfort, dignity, and connection during the holiday season.



United Way Adopt a Family - December 17, 2025

In partnership with United Way of Greater Cincinnati, LHOI participated in the annual Adopt-A-Family program, bringing holiday joy and essential support to families in need. Through this effort, LHOI supported 17 families in Lincoln Heights, many led by caregivers who have stepped up for loved ones. Together, we helped ease their burden while ensuring children experienced the warmth and joy of the holiday season. This partnership reflects our shared commitment to uplifting families and strengthening our community.

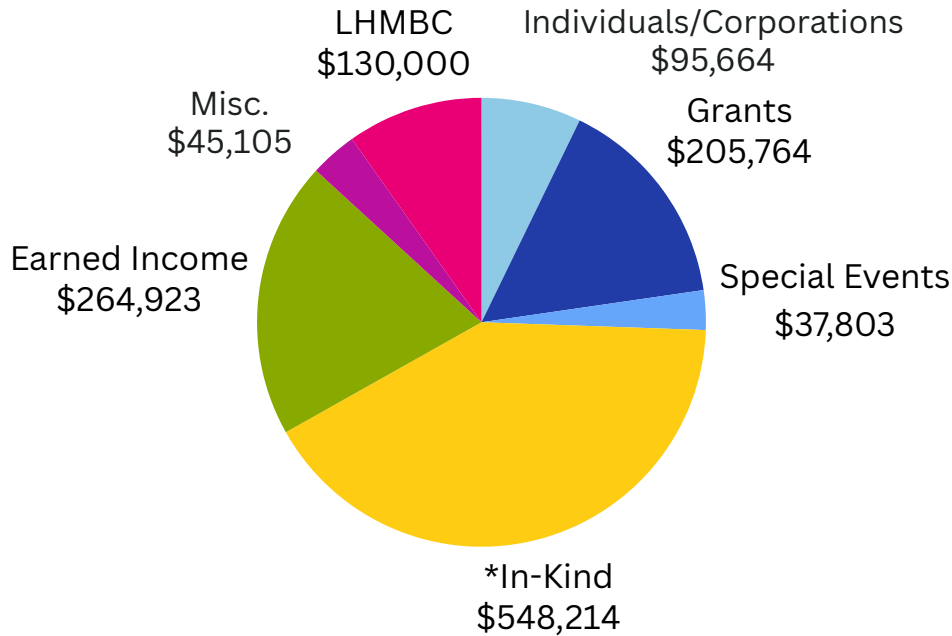

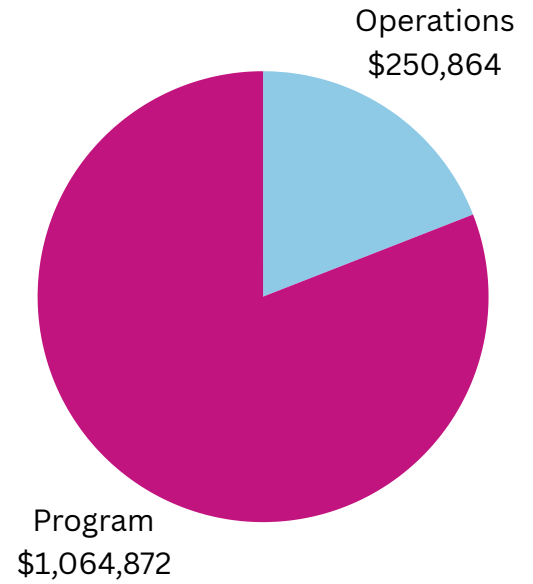
FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

REVENUE: \$1,327,473

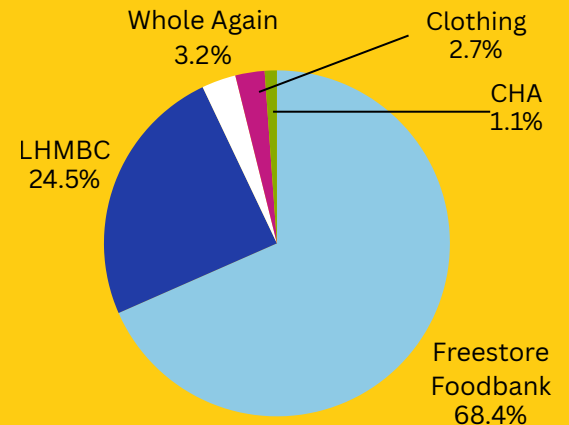
